

At UF, the FAFSA is the only financial aid application you need to complete.

ONE FORM. Many funding possibilities.

The FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) is the federal financial aid form used by UF to determine your eligibility for financial assistance.

Completing the FAFSA allows you to be automatically considered for all federal, state and university need-based financial aid programs offered at UF.

To receive the best financial aid offer, complete the FAFSA as early as possible, starting October 1st.

Although you must be accepted for enrollment at UF before you are considered for financial aid, you should apply for aid before being admitted.

HOW TO APPLY FOR FINANCIAL AID

Complete the 2023-24 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) on or after October 1, 2022.

Apply each year — financial aid is not renewed automatically.

- Create an FSA ID at studentaid.gov/fsa-id. An FSA ID gives you access to Federal Student Aid’s online systems and can serve as your legal signature.
- Go to fafsa.gov to complete your FAFSA. Tips throughout the application help you understand the questions. Most people complete the FAFSA in less than 30 minutes.
- List “University of Florida” and the UF Federal School Code (001535) as a school choice in the “School Selection” section.
- Sign your FAFSA electronically using your FSA ID. Parents of dependent students can also sign electronically but must request their own FSA ID.
- Use the IRS Data Retrieval Tool, when possible, to automatically import your tax information into your FAFSA. The 2023-24 FAFSA will use 2021 income and tax information for students and parents.
- After successfully submitting your FAFSA, save a copy of the confirmation page. This page contains your confirmation number and other important information.

MERIT-BASED AID offers financial support based on a student's academic achievements and talents.

NEED-BASED AID provides funds for students based on their level of financial need.

You may receive both types of aid to fund your studies.

Your financial aid offer could include grants and scholarships that you do not have to repay, loans that you will repay over time, and on-campus work-study employment opportunities. You must complete a FAFSA to be considered for all sources of need-based financial aid.

Your financial aid package can be as unique as you are! We customize your aid package to match your academic and financial situation through a variety of aid programs. There are aid programs for in-state, out-of-state, and transfer students.

Grants

Grants are awarded to students who show financial need. All you need to do to be considered for grants is complete the FAFSA. Grants include the Federal Pell Grant, Federal Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grant, Florida Student Assistance Grant, UF Excellence Grant, UF Undergraduate Grant, UF Welcome Grant, and the UF Orange and Blue Grant.

Scholarships

Scholarships may be awarded based on merit or financial need. Like grants, scholarships do not have to be repaid.

The **Florida Bright Futures Scholarship Program**, funded by the State of Florida Department of Education, provides scholarships to in-state residents based on high school academic achievement. For more information, visit your high school guidance office or call (888) 827-2004 prior to high school graduation.

The **Benacquisto Scholarship** is offered to in-state residents by the Florida Department of Education and covers UF's standard cost of attendance less the amount of the Bright Futures and National Merit Scholarship awards. The Benacquisto Scholarship is a state-funded program that is appropriated by the legislature each year.

The **Machen Florida Opportunity Scholars Program** (MFOS) provides financial resources and individual support for in-state, first-generation, low-income undergraduate students. This scholarship provides funding up to full financial need for four years of undergraduate study.

After completing the FAFSA, students are invited to become MFOS scholars if they meet the initial eligibility criteria.

91% of UF freshmen receive grants or scholarships.

UF awards a limited number of **Merit-Based Scholarships**. No separate application is needed beyond the application for admission. The scholarship review process is holistic — there is no automatic awarding of UF scholarships based on test scores or GPA. Students who are selected for a merit-based scholarship will be notified mid-March 2023.

The **Honors Program** offers scholarships for incoming students who rank at the top of their class and demonstrate service to the community, extracurricular involvement, leadership and other criteria.

Out-of-State Tuition Waivers are designed to reduce out-of-state tuition for selected students. Students must be classified as non-Florida residents for tuition purposes by UF's February Decision Day in order to be considered for a tuition waiver.

Work-Study Employment

Federal Work-Study provides part-time jobs for students with financial need and allows them to earn money to help pay educational expenses.

Work-study positions help students gain valuable work experience, build their résumés, make connections across campus, and have a more enriching college experience.

Loans

Loans are a type of financial assistance that enable students and parents to borrow funds to help pay for educational expenses. A loan is money you borrow and must pay back with interest. Subsidized loans do not accrue interest while you are in school for at least half-time or during deferment periods.
